**COMMODITY JURISDICTION DETERMINATION FOR: AeroTech
Consumer Aerospace and Quest Aerospace Single-Use and Reloadable Hobby
Rocket Motors and Rocket Motor Reloading Kits**

Dear Mr. Rosenfield:

The products described in your submission are single use rocket motors, reloadable rocket motors, and rocket motor reload kits for hobby rockets. This is in part a reconsideration of CJ 0075-16.

A technical review of your commodity jurisdiction (CJ) request has been concluded by requisite agencies of the United States government. The findings of that technical review are:

A split jurisdiction determination has been decided. The determination applies as follows:

The Department of State has determined that the **AeroTech Consumer Aerospace and Quest Aerospace Single-Use & Reloadable Hobby Rocket Motors and Rocket Motor Reloading Kits containing more than five pounds of propellant are subject to its jurisdiction in accordance with the International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR) (22 CFR parts 120 through 130)**. They are designated defense articles under Category IV(d)(7) of the United States Munitions List (USML). Pursuant to the ITAR, a license or other form of approval is required prior to any export or temporary import.

Additionally, the Department of State has determined that the **AeroTech Consumer Aerospace and Quest Aerospace Single-Use & Reloadable**

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
Hobby Rocket Motors and Rocket Motor Reloading Kits containing five pounds of propellant or less are not subject to its jurisdiction. However, the item is subject to the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) administered by the Department of Commerce, Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS). Should you require information on how to classify your item or satisfy the applicable regulatory requirements of the EAR, please contact the BIS Office of Exporter Services at (202) 482-4811.

The determination is made based upon Note 1 to USML Category IV(d). Per Note 1, no provision of USML Category IV(d) will apply to or otherwise control model or high power rocket motors certified for U.S. consumer use under National Fire Protection Association Code 1125 and that contain no more than five pounds of propellant.

Should you not concur with this determination and have additional facts not included in the original submission, you may submit a new CJ request. If you do not concur with this determination and have no additional facts to present, then you may request that this determination be reviewed by the Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Defense Trade Controls.
